It is a learning process to know how to resolve conflicts

Who has not had a moment of trials in this life? Who has not been attacked by the madness of the enemy? Whether in workplaces, at home with the family or neighbors or friends, who has not received a knife in the back from people who apparently are friends to you? Indeed we all have experienced difficulties and trials in our lives. We don't have to be bad people to be attacked by the enemy. Sometimes a person has just to be driven by the temptations of the devil and instead of doing something that is constructive, he/she will react in a betrayal manner to express vengeance and have the illusion that such an act will make him/her stronger. However our Lord Jesus teaches us not to be angry at people and if a person strikes you at the right cheek, present him/her the other one. All this has been said to invite us become an instrument and a channel of peace in a society where some people are unpredictable. Therefore it is important for us not to act under the influence of emotions; otherwise we will make big mistakes that will not bring us anything good. When we are not happy about something, take a big breath and think about the responsibility we all have to be another Christ in our communities. Then offer the problem to God and let God bring justice to the issue that has bothered us. Such a mature reaction will bring us more peace in the heart than anything else. It is an essential act of wisdom important for the stability of our families and the moral education of our children who will learn from us how to resolve conflicts. Every reaction we make as parents either positive or negative will have an impact on our children. That is the reason why Jesus continues to guide us through the faith so that when we have problems, before anything else, we are invited to offer them to God. Problems are part of our human nature. They will always be there, either they may come from illness or other times they are imposed upon us from the madness and the hypocrisy of those who are still living their lives under the direction of the enemy. The truth is that the Holy Spirit will never encourage a person to harm another one either directly or indirectly. The Holy Spirit likes unity between people and that is the reason why whenever we follow the temptations to do evil things to another child of God, it is the devil that is at work. Because of the possibilities for us to be another Judas, we have to pray so that we don't fall into temptations. It means that we must be loyal, sincere and authentic to

those who are in contact with us. If we decide to do otherwise, we will pay for it because whoever hits with the sword will be perished by the sword. If we take the time to reflect upon this wisdom, we will be less inclined to do wrong to others. We all can be victims of people's hypocrisy, while we are still alive. We have to be constantly in this attitude of prayer so that the Lord may be with us. We need the help of the Lord in our lives because the enemy is at work in the world trying to install his reign of terror, conflict and division. As the Lord blesses us with His presence, it is our responsibility to recognize Him and listen to Him in order for us to remain calm. If we fail to recognize His presence and ignore His message there is the risk for us to fall in the temptation of despair and even to use violence toward those who are attacking us. Being followers of the Lord, we should not panic or be afraid. If the Lord is with us, who can be against us? When we are attacked unjustly by people, just pray and if you are patient you will see the goodness of the Lord. It is important to turn the other cheek in order to keep our hands pure and without any stain. In doing so, the justice of the Lord will come to us in His proper time. Therefore we must know how to wait. This life is not easy because the presence of devil is still at large looking for followers. As we are exposed to so many problems in our lives, it is easy to fall into discouragement to the point of seeing nothing but darkness. Indeed there are moments when the cross appeared to be heavier than other times and no matter what you do, it seems that things must happen. You don't have to look for them, they are always there. Sometimes you don't go out, you don't talk to people but they have a way to find something bad about you. You get involved in many activities and this can be a source for criticism. So, basically when we don't walk with Jesus in a very sincere relationship with Him, we can easily fall in gossiping which has the potential to turn us into agents of division. Because of this tendency for us to contribute to conflicts and division in our midst, it is important to have this natural reflex to turn to God and to put our trust in Him. This is where we will find hope and strength to move forward and to understand that we are not the only ones in this battle. Every human on earth has a cross to carry and it is very wise not to laugh at others when they have their crosses of life.

**Part Three: The Role of the Christian Family
Family, Become What You Are****I - FORMING A COMMUNITY OF PERSONS****Offenses Against Women's Dignity**

24. Unfortunately the Christian message about the dignity of women is contradicted by that persistent mentality which considers the human being not as a person but as a thing, as an object of trade, at the service of selfish interest and mere pleasure: the first victims of this mentality are women.

This mentality produces very bitter fruits, such as contempt for men and for women, slavery, oppression of the weak, pornography, prostitution-especially in an organized form-and all those various forms of discrimination that exist in the fields of education, employment, wages, etc.

Besides, many forms of degrading discrimination still persist today in a great part of our society that affect and seriously harm particular categories of women, as for example childless wives, widows, separated or divorced women, and unmarried mothers.

The Synod Fathers deplored these and other forms of discrimination as strongly as possible. I therefore ask that vigorous and incisive pastoral action be taken by all to overcome them definitively so that the image of God that shines in all human beings without exception may be fully respected.

Men as Husbands and Fathers

25. Within the conjugal and family communion-community, the man is called upon to live his gift and role as husband and father.


In his wife he sees the fulfillment of God's intention: "It is not good that the man should be alone, I will make him a helper fit for him," and he makes his own the cry of Adam, the first husband: "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh."

Authentic conjugal love presupposes and requires that a man have a profound respect for the equal dignity of his wife; "You are not her master," writes St. Ambrose, "but her husband; she was not given to you to be your slave, but your wife.... Reciprocate her attentiveness to you and be grateful to her for her love." With his wife a man should live "a very special form of personal friendship." As for the Christian, he is called upon to develop a new attitude of love, manifesting towards his wife a charity that is both gentle and strong like that which Christ has for the Church.

Love for his wife as mother of their children and love for the children themselves are for the man the natural way of understanding and fulfilling his own fatherhood. Above all where social and cultural conditions so easily encourage a father to be less concerned with his family or at any rate less involved in the work of education, efforts must be made to restore socially the conviction that the place and task of the father in and for the family is of unique and irreplaceable importance. As experience teaches, the absence of a father causes psychological and moral imbalance and notable difficulties in family relationships, as does, in contrary circumstances, the oppressive presence of a father, especially where there still prevails the phenomenon of "machismo," or a wrong superiority of male prerogatives which humiliates women and inhibits the development of healthy family relationships.

In revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God, a man is called upon to ensure the harmonious and united development of all the members of the family: he will perform this task by exercising generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother, by a more solicitous commitment to education, a task he shares with his wife, by work which is never a cause of division in the family but promotes its unity and stability, and by means of the witness he gives of an adult Christian life which effectively introduces the children into the living experience of Christ and the Church.

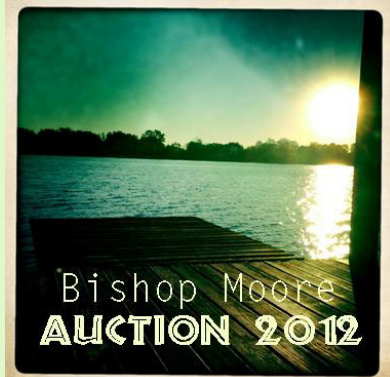

Es un proceso de aprendizaje saber cómo resolver los conflictos
 ¿Quién no ha tenido un momento de dificultades en esta vida? ¿Quién no ha sido atacado por la locura del enemigo? Ya sea en los lugares de trabajo, en casa con la familia o vecinos o amigos que aún no ha recibido una puñalada por la espalda de la gente que aparentemente se presentan como amigos de verdad? De hecho, todos tenemos dificultades y las pruebas en nuestras vidas. No tiene que ser mala gente para ser atacado por el enemigo. A veces una persona puede ser impulsado por las tentaciones del diablo y en vez de hacer algo que es constructivo, él / ella va a reaccionar de una manera que expresa la traición y la venganza como para demostrar su poder. Sin embargo, nuestro Señor Jesús nos enseña a no estar enojado con la gente y si una persona te da una bofetada en la mejilla derecha, presentale la otra. Todo esto se ha dicho que nos invitan a ser un instrumento y un canal de paz en una sociedad donde las personas son impredecibles. Por lo tanto, es importante para nosotros, no actuar bajo la influencia de las emociones, de lo contrario vamos a cometer errores grandes que no nos van a traer nada bueno. Cuando no estamos contentos con algo, tomar una respiración grande y reflexionar sobre la responsabilidad que todos tenemos que ser otro Cristo en nuestras comunidades. A continuación ofrecemos el problema a Dios y dejar que Dios haga justicia a la cuestión que nos ha molestado. Una reacción madura nos traerá más paz en el corazón que otra cosa. Es un acto esencial de la sabiduría importante para la estabilidad de nuestras familias y la educación moral de nuestros hijos que aprendan de nosotros cómo resolver los conflictos. Todas las reacciones que hacemos como padres, ya sea positiva o negativa tendrá un impacto en nuestros hijos. Esa es la razón por la cual Jesús continúa guiándonos a través de la fe, para que cuando tengamos problemas, antes que nada, se nos invita a ofrecer a Dios. Los problemas son parte de nuestra naturaleza humana. Ellos siempre estarán allí. Pueden provenir de una enfermedad u otras veces se nos impone desde la locura y la hipocresía de aquellos que todavía viven sus vidas bajo la dirección del enemigo. La verdad es que el Espíritu Santo nunca anima a una persona para destruir la vida de los demás que sea en forma directa o indirecta. El Espíritu Santo quiere la unidad entre la gente y esa es la razón por la cual siempre que uno siga las tentaciones de hacer mal a un otro hijo de Dios, es el diablo que está actuando. Debido a las posibilidades de que seamos otro Judas, tenemos que rezar para que no caigamos en las tentaciones de ser hipócrita. Esto significa que tenemos que ser leal, sincero y auténtico a los que están en contacto con nosotros. Si decidimos hacer otra cosa, vamos a pagar por ello, porque quien golpea con la espada será muerto por la espada. Si nos tomamos el tiempo para reflexionar sobre esta sabiduría, estaremos menos dispuestos a hacer el mal a otros. Todos podemos ser víctimas de la hipocresía de la gente, mientras que todavía estamos vivos. Tenemos que estar constantemente en actitud de oración para que el Señor sea con nosotros. Necesitamos la ayuda del Señor en nuestras vidas, porque el enemigo está presente en el mundo tratando de instalar su reinado de terror, el conflicto y la división. Como el Señor nos bendice con su presencia, es nuestra responsabilidad de reconocerlo y escucharlo para que podamos mantener la calma. Si no

somos capaces de reconocer su presencia y pasar por alto su mensaje se corre el riesgo de que caigamos en la tentación de la desesperación e incluso al uso de la violencia hacia aquellos que nos atacan. Ser seguidores del Señor significa que no debemos entrar en pánico o miedo. Si el Señor está con nosotros, quién puede estar contra nosotros? Cuando somos atacados injustamente por la gente, sólo rezar es la solución y si tienes la paciencia podrás ver la bondad del Señor. Es importante dar la otra mejilla con el fin de mantener las manos puras y sin mancha. De este modo, la justicia del Señor vendrá a nosotros en su momento adecuado. Por lo tanto, tenemos que saber esperar. Esta vida no es fácil debido a la presencia del diablo sigue siendo en general en busca de seguidores. Al estar expuestos a tantos problemas en nuestras vidas, es fácil caer en el desaliento hasta el punto de no ver nada más que oscuridad. De hecho hay momentos en que la cruz parece ser más pesada que otras veces y no importa lo que haces, parece que las cosas no funcionan. Usted no tiene que buscarlos, ellos siempre están allí. A veces uno no sale, no habla con la gente, pero ellos tienen una manera de encontrar algo malo acerca de ti. Uno se involucra en muchas actividades y esto puede ser una fuente de críticas. Así básicamente, cuando no caminamos con Jesús en una relación muy sincera con él, uno puede caer fácilmente en el camino que tiene el potencial para convertirnos en agentes de la división. Debido a esta tendencia para que contribuyan a los conflictos y la división entre nosotros, es importante tener este reflejo natural para volverse a Dios y poner nuestra confianza en él. Aquí es donde vamos a encontrar la esperanza y la fortaleza para seguir adelante y entender que no somos los únicos en esta batalla.
